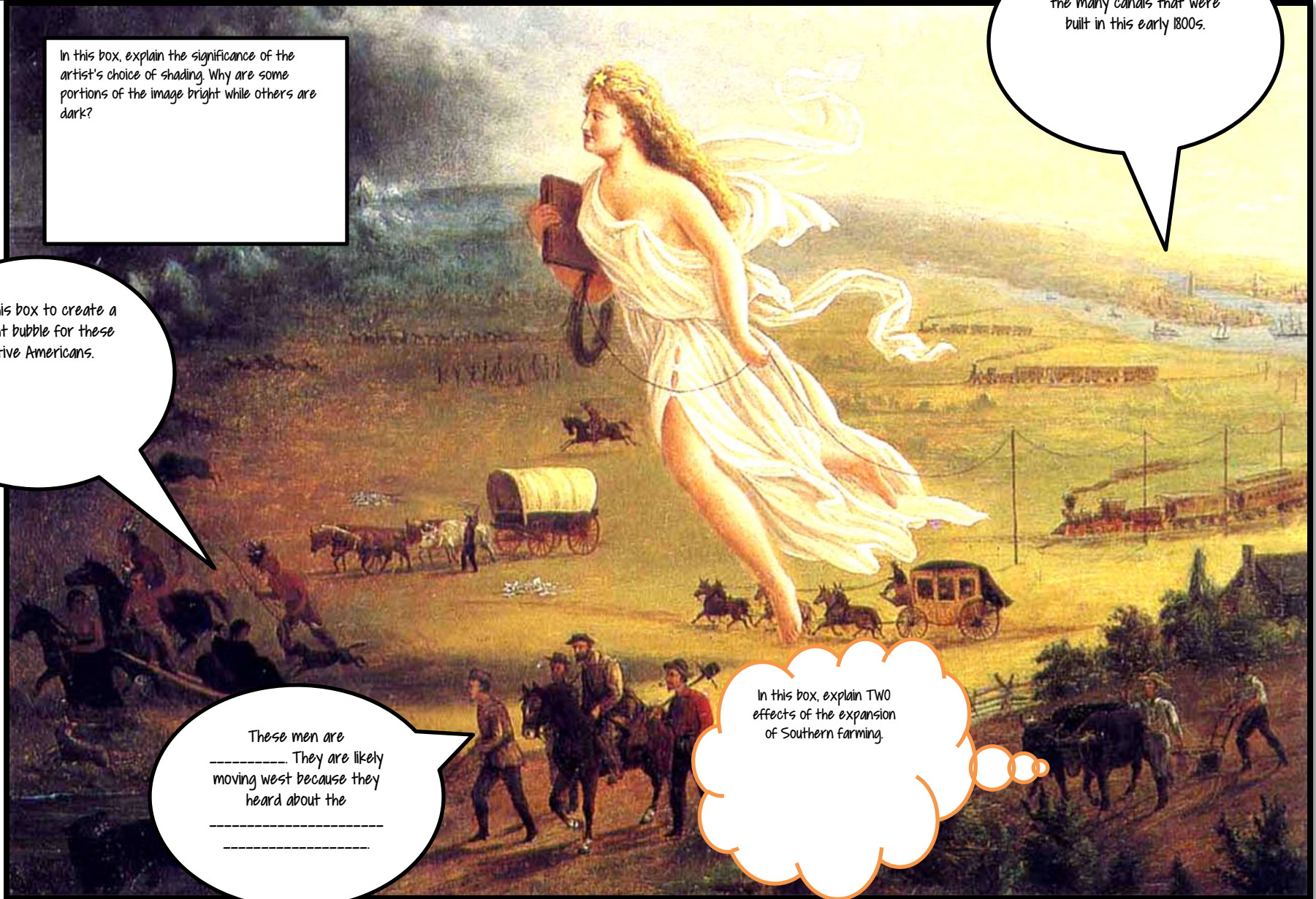
Explain the significance of the many canals that were built in this early 1800s.
