



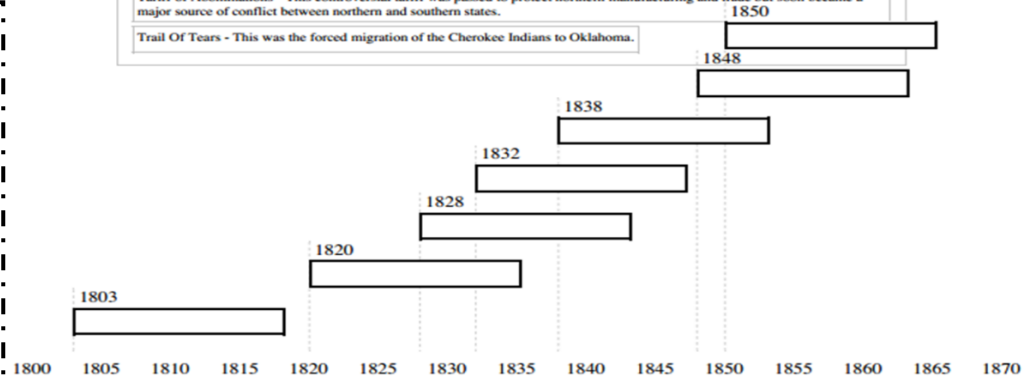

DESCRIBE THE ELECTION OF 1828:

- LEARNING:**
- Compromise of 1850 - This was an agreement that California would be admitted to the Union, the slave trade in the District of Columbia would be restricted, and the Fugitive Slave Law would be enforced.
 - Louisiana Purchase - This was a territory in the western U.S. purchased from France for \$15 million.
 - Mexican War - Battles between U.S. and Mexico over the southern Texas border.
 - Missouri Compromise - This was a congressional agreement which included the admission of one free and one slave state to maintain the balance of free and slave states in the Union.
 - Nullification crisis - This was the principle that a state government can declare a law of the national government invalid within the borders of the state.
 - Tariff of Abominations - This controversial tariff was passed to protect northern manufacturing and trade but soon became a major source of conflict between northern and southern states.
 - Trail Of Tears - This was the forced migration of the Cherokee Indians to Oklahoma.
