Reassessment Plan

Contracts

All students will complete an academic contract prior to their first summative assessment. The contract is an acknowledgement that students have been notified of the conditions and terms that must be satisfied before being eligible for a re-test.

Test Performance

All students are expected to prepare for any assessment that is administered in class. In an effort to ensure success on tests, social studies teachers will provide students with review sheets and/or study guides. Students are expected to complete these assignments in order to be eligible for a reassessment. On occasion, teachers will ask students to reflect on individual questions that they missed on an assessment. The teacher has the right to require that the student complete this handout in order to be eligible for a re-test.

Differentiation

- Because students have different needs and abilities, the opportunities for reassessment vary by course level. We
 expect our students to be prepared for success the first time they are assessed. However, if a student needs
 additional opportunities to be reassessed, the number of re-test opportunities per semester are as follows:
 - College Prep courses: 3 opportunities
 - Honors courses: 2 opportunities
 - AP courses: 1 opportunity
- Students in College Prep or Honors courses may request a re-test if their score on a summative assessment ranges from 75-56. Students who score 55 or below on the original assessment are required to take a re-test. Failure to do so means that the parent or guardian of the student will be contacted immediately.
- Students enrolled in AP courses may request a re-test if their score on a summative assessment ranges from 65-56.
 Students who score 55 or below on the original assessment are required to take a re-test. Failure to do so means that the parent or guardian of the student will be contacted immediately.
- Provided the student completes all re-test requirements, the maximum score that can be earned on a re-test is 75%.
- Please note: Students who have already exhausted all of their reassessment opportunities will not be eligible to re-assess.

Scheduling

It is rare that class time can be devoted to reassessments. Therefore, reassessments are typically scheduled to take place during lunch periods, before school, or after school. It is the responsibility of the student to communicate with the teacher regarding arrangements.

A teacher intervention plan will be posted on the school's web site and in each social studies teacher's classroom.

The Fine Print...

For College Prep and Honors courses, reassessments must be completed no later than five (5) school days after the scores from the original test have been posted OR on the reassessment date set by the teacher.

For Advanced Placement courses, students must schedule and complete their one reassessment opportunity prior to the week that semester exams are administered.
